Here are a few important guidelines from National Headquarters to keep in mind:

 "Symbols <u>CAN</u> be worn at marches, protests, rallies and other social action activities that align with the Sorority's principles and positions."

Members <u>CANNOT</u>

- Wear paraphernalia to fundraisers, campaign events and other partisan activities
- Post pictures of themselves in Delta symbols with candidates for office
- Speak to the press on behalf of the Sorority.
- Use or wear the Sorority's Crest, logos or other intellectual property and symbols on campaign or other partisan material

Academic Excellence:

- Eleven members have earned terminal degrees.
